COURSE DESCRIPTION & OVERALL GOAL

This workshop will review principles for the diagnosis, treatment, and management of latent TB infection and TB disease and address TB in special populations. The first day will focus on LTBI, including risk-based screening, testing methods, treatment options, and strategies for treatment completion. The rest of the course will build on basic concepts and explore key aspects of TB diagnostics, treatment and management. The format will include lectures and interactive case discussions.

Please note, attendees who are unable to participate in the full three-day workshop have the option to attend the one day LTBI focused stand-alone training on Tuesday June 26, 2018. (*Refer to the registration section of this brochure.*)

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

The workshop is designed for physicians, nurses and healthcare professionals who are involved in the diagnosis and management of TB patients.

WHY COURSE IS NEEDED

As the incidence of tuberculosis continues to decline, maintaining clinical and public health expertise in TB is particularly challenging. Therefore, ongoing training and education are important for healthcare providers to enhance skills in TB diagnosis, follow recommended treatment guidelines, and interact effectively with public health agencies.

OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of this workshop, participants should be better able to:

- Recognize the latest advances for assessing risk, testing and treating TB infection to prevent development of disease.
- Integrate current recommendations for the prevention and management of TB infection and implement recommendations for prompt diagnosis, appropriate treatment and effective management of tuberculosis disease.
- Integrate current recommendations for the prevention and management of tuberculosis in special populations.
- Develop strategies for implementing individualized case management of a patient with TB.
