COURSE DESCRIPTION & OVERALL GOAL

This interactive training will address key aspects of TB case management from a nursing perspective, including cultural competency, assessing and improving adherence, TB contact investigations, working with special populations, managing complications of TB treatment and incorporating nurse case management skills as part of patient-centered TB care. The format includes pre-recorded lectures for self-paced learning accompanied by three live web-based sessions with discussions and case studies.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

Enrollment is limited to registered nurses who are responsible for providing TB case management for patients with TB infection and disease.

WHY COURSE IS NEEDED

As the incidence of tuberculosis continues to decline, maintaining clinical and public health expertise in this area is particularly challenging. Therefore, ongoing training and education are important for healthcare providers to enhance skills in nursing assessment, problem solving, case management, and enhancing adherence.

OBJECTIVES

At the conclusion of this activity participants should be better able to:

- Explain the concepts of tuberculosis case management in order to utilize an appropriate case management system
- Apply concepts of cultural competency to provide patient-centered TB care.
- Integrate case management of patients with co-morbid conditions and special circumstances to promote continuity of care.
- Use a case management plan to document care practices and plan for future needs.
- Develop approaches for addressing challenges in the management of patients with tuberculosis to ensure adherence.
- Define the nurse's role in contact investigations, including evaluation and treatment of identified contacts.
