The purpose of this training is to provide updates on current topics in tuberculosis, including diagnosis and treatment of latent TB infection, pediatric TB, contact investigations in congregate settings, legal interventions, and TB in correctional facilities. This training is designed for physicians and nurses and other healthcare professionals involved in the diagnosis and management of patients with TB.

WHY COURSE IS NEEDED

As the incidence of tuberculosis continues to decline, maintaining clinical and public health expertise in TB is particularly challenging. This training aims to build the TB knowledge base of clinicians in order to promptly identify and adequately treat cases of latent TB infection and TB disease.

- Discuss strategies for addressing the challenges of TB prevention and control involving correctional facilities
- Utilize principles of contact investigation to assess potential TB transmission and exposure in congregate settings

- Explain the relationship between TB and other co-morbid conditions to ensure proper diagnosis and treatment
- Discuss methods for detecting and treating TB infection and disease in children and adolescents
