COURSE DESCRIPTION & OVERALL GOAL

This two-day intensive workshop explores topics in the diagnosis and treatment of latent TB infection (LTBI) and TB disease. Day 1 will cover diagnostic strategies, the new LTBI regimen, and management of adverse drug reactions. Day 2 will focus on collaboration between the public and private sectors and the management of patients with other health and social issues. The format includes lectures, discussions, and case studies.

WHO SHOULD ATTEND

This workshop is designed for physicians, nurses and healthcare professionals, who are involved in the management of patients with TB, supervise those who provide care for TB patients, or are TB control staff responsible for program management. WHY COURSE IS NEEDED

As the incidence of tuberculosis continues to decline, maintaining clinical and public health expertise in TB is particularly challenging. Therefore, ongoing training and education are important to develop and enhance skills in the diagnosis of TB, knowledge of recommended treatment guidelines, and the ability to interact effectively with public health agencies. This type of training is also important for new healthcare providers working in TB control or other settings.

OBJECTIVES

Upon completion of this workshop, participants will be able to:

- Apply current advances for assessing risk, testing and treating latent TB infection to prevent development of disease
- Apply recommendations for the diagnosis and treatment of TB disease to prevent transmission and development of primary drug resistance
- Identify appropriate TB infection control measures along the continuum of care to prevent transmission and future cases of TB
